

Foodservice

1. All students are eligible to eat meals prepared by school employees or to bring meals from home. Milk and other beverages consistent with state and/or federal regulations or Board Policy will be ~~are~~ available at all schools. If the school is operating an open campus, students may leave for meals if so desired.
2. Principals of each school will decide where students will eat and the time for lunch periods in their respective buildings consistent with state and/or federal regulations or Board Policy.
3. Supervision of school lunch personnel is the responsibility of the director of foodservice. Principals or other authorized persons will inform the lunchroom staff of any daily changes necessary, i.e., change in lunch time, field trip, etc.
4. The method of money-taking is the responsibility of the director of foodservice with the cooperation of the principals.
5. Supervision of students is not to be done by lunchroom personnel. This is to be done by the principals or their designee(s).

Free and Reduced Price Foodservice

The district shall take part as feasible in the National School Lunch and other food programs which may become available.

The administration shall establish regulations which conform with state and federal (or other) requirements regarding participation in programs for free and reduced price meals and supplementary food. Such regulations shall be presented to the Board from time to time for its information.
