Dear Parent/Guardian,

If you suspect that your child is using drugs or alcohol, take action. You and your family are not alone. There are many options to seek help for your family or teen. Substance abuse issues are often addressed through a combination of approaches, so it's essential to find out what help is needed and available before you intervene. Effective intervention includes physical, psychological, emotional and social concerns and will involve family members. In most cases a good screening or evaluation can help you determine what types of resources are needed.
