

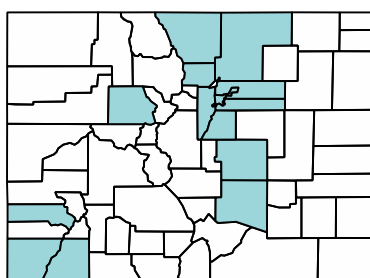


# Colorado SNAPSHOT

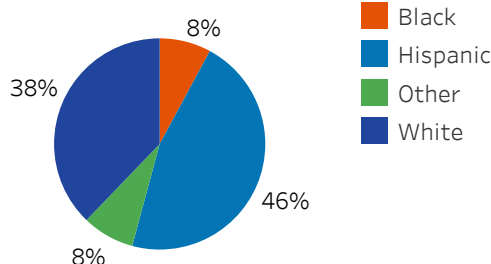
