#### **What is Concurrent Enrollment**

A Concurrent Enrollment class gives you the opportunity to receive college credit at no cost to you through a Colorado community college. This is for all students regardless of if you know what your degree or career path is.

DEFINITIONS		
	Your S# comes from the College when you apply. Once you apply, you will receive an email with your S#.	
S# vs SASID	No matter what Colorado community college you apply to, your S# will stay the same. However, you need to apply to the college specific to the course you are taking.	
	Your SASID is your ID # issued by Cherry Creek School District.	
	Residency: Enter citizenship information and your demographic information. U.S. Citizens: Social security number is required.	
Social Security Number (SSN)	All colleges will ask you to provide your social security number. This information is used to match past/future records, and in Colorado, is tied to your College Opportunity Fund (COF) dollars. In order to participate in Concurrent Enrollment, you are required to authorize the use of your COF to offset the cost of tuition, and Cherry Creek School District pays the remaining amount.	
College Opportunity Fund (COF)	College Opportunity Fund (You can apply to this fund when you apply to the community college. The application will ask if you would like the community college to apply for the fund on your behalf. Mark YES.)	



### **Definitions Continued**

Prerequisite	A course or other requirement that a student must take prior to enrolling in a specific course or program.
Drop a Course	When a student drops a course, the course will not appear on their College transcript.
	COF will not be applied.
Guaranteed Transfer (GT)	GT Pathways courses, in which the student earns a C- or higher, will always transfer and apply to GT Pathways requirements in AA, AS and most bachelor's degrees at every public Colorado college and university.  GT Pathways do not apply to some degrees (such as many engineering, computer science, nursing and others <u>listed here</u> ).  You should always seek advising from the appropriate advisor at the college or university you plan to attend to ensure you are selecting the appropriate coursework for your degree and that it will apply to those degree requirements.
